Thurday - The Many Colors of Me: we all have many colors, but what if you could dress in your favorite color from head to toe! Today is your chance to show case your favorite.


Friday - If I Ran The Zoo; to end our week in celebration, bring in a picture of your favorite animal, or dress up as your favorite animal. The more creative the better!
