

collaboration
(noun)

1. The **collaboration** requires them to work with others.
2. Our **collaboration** led to cooperation, alliances, and partnerships with other groups.
3. The artists' **collaboration** created a new type of music for them both.

determination
(noun)

1. When you have **determination**, you stay firm in your desire to achieve a goal.
2. It takes a great deal of **determination**, or resolve, to train for the Olympics and Special Olympics.
3. She earned an advanced degree through discipline and **determination**.

disband
(verb)

1. When we **disband** the organization, we will stop working together.
2. Once we **disband** the main group, the other groups will dissolve as well.
3. If we **disband** the organization, the users will unite and join together on their own.

donated
(adjective)

1. The **donated** land was given as a gift to a local charity.
2. The **donated** items were recorded in the charity's ledger.
3. The charity's thrift store is full of **donated** items.

generation
(noun)

1. A **generation** includes all of the people who grow up during the same time period.
2. A **generation** is the length of time it takes an animal to become an adult and have offspring.
3. When the young president was elected, many felt that the leadership had passed from one **generation** to the next.

generation
(noun)

1. A **generation** is chunk of time that roughly amounts to the time between when parents and their children are born.
2. This was the fifth **generation** her family had lived in Arizona.
3. His family fell into hard times and it took them a **generation** to recover.

litter
(verb)

1. You should dispose of trash properly and not **litter**.
2. If we all **litter**, trash will pile up and harm people, plants, animals, and the environment.
3. It is illegal to **litter**, so you can get in trouble with the police.

rivalry
(noun)

1. The brothers' **rivalry** caused them to constantly compete for superiority in everything.
2. After a long **rivalry**, the opponents found harmony when they became teammates.
3. In a **rivalry**, or competition, people work against each other, not together.

soar
(verb)

1. When airplanes **soar**, they fly high in the air.
2. I like to watch the hawks that **soar** in the air near my house.
3. If you see the baseball **soar**, or fly, over the back fence, it probably means the batter will get a home run!

symbiosis
(noun)

1. **Symbiosis**, in which two different species of organisms associate with each other, often helps them both.
2. An example of **symbiosis** is the Egyptian plover bird cleaning the teeth of a crocodile.
3. Parasitism is a type of **symbiosis** that is harmful to one of the organisms.

unity
(noun)

1. The speaker's words created a sense of **unity** and joined the group in a single purpose.
2. A series of scandals threatened the political party's **unity**.
3. The country's **unity** was strengthened by the people's common goals and hopes.
